The Chancellor thinks it His
humble Duty to acquaint Your
Majesty, that, in obedience to the
commands of the Prince of Wales,
and Duke of York, He waited upon
Their Royal Highnesses at York
House; where He also saw Prince
Edward. The Language of all
the Princes was as satisfactory, as
so untoward an occasion would
admit of; where, unfortunately, nothing,
which is past, can be altered,

or repaired, but by an implicit
submission to your Majesty's Pleasure
for the future. The Chancellor
was afraid of intruding upon
your Majesty, in any other
manner than this, on such an
occasion: But, if your Majesty
thinks fit to call for a more
particular account, He needs
not add, that He waits your
Majesty's pleasure.
