In consequence of having seen the Prince of Wales yesterday  
who communicated to me the letter he had received the  
Evening preceding from Mr. Pitt as ~~Richard~~ called upon  
me for support to the proposition made in my name to  
him by Mr. Pitt for his future Establishment; I certainly  
feel myself in honour bound to declare that I desire  
Mr. Pitt will make every exertion to carry through  
the measure as originally proposed, ~~at the~~  
same time I could find the Prince of Wales fully  
willing to have that income as tightly bound as Mr. Pitt  
can propose to prevent future Debt. He has left  
Lord Cholmondeley in Town to make any explanation  
as to that point, and mentioned having seen the Lord  
Chancellor whom he has from the by being acquainted  
with his situation, ~~who perhaps may debate the propriety~~  
~~of the measure~~ <sup>by other lights as to the Prince's present</sup> ~~and I can not~~  
~~but add~~ <sup>to Mr. Pitt</sup> that in the present late state of the business  
any yielding would certainly have the same mode of  
as a defeat. but any regulation to prevent future Debt  
is wise and proper.
