Since the arrival at Berlin H. R. H. the Prince Augustus, has upon the whole enjoyed a better state of health, than travelling. However the cold climate shows evidently it's hurtful influence, for the paroxysms of the indisposition have since six years not been so frequent than this winter. Both the expectoration of the matter, & the difficulty in breathing, leaves H. R. H. only for short intervalls, and soon after a new paroxysm comes on again.

Altogether the present state of health  
of the Prince is such, that it seems  
not to allow any thought of removing  
from this town, during the winter,  
or early in the spring from here,  
without throwing the Patient's life  
in danger.

I thank it to H. R. H.'s constancy  
in taking remedies, and to His pru-  
dence in the diet, that at present  
he breathes free, and that the expec-  
tation of matter has much diminished  
so that He has been out, but He  
has not been able to sleep in the  
bed, but only in an arm chair.
