Windsor Sept. 26th 1803.

My Dear Daughter

This morning I received your letter of 2^d of last month, in the present moment it is scarcely possible to expect great regularity in this delivery, this will be conveyed through the channel you have proposed.

I am happy to find you are so diligently employed on the Choir for the Villa I am building at Richmond, it advances but slowly partly to a certain want of diligence in Wyatt and partly to the present want of workmen they being engaged for the busy season we must soon expect. I never thought I should have adopted Gothic instead of Grecian Architecture, but the bad taste of the last party has so entirely corrupted the Professors of the latter I have taken to this form from thinking Wyatt perfect in that style, of which my House will almost be a good example. The body of the House is completed, and now its floors and windows are preparing, the chief stairs cannot be built till the next summer, the East Wing is nearly as far w^{an}, the entrance of the Court is now building and the other wing will be ready to have next summer. by this you may see that I cannot as yet calculate how soon the whole will be finished.
