We beg leave to submit to His Majesty the following opinion. That we consider the same degree of attendance upon His Majesty, which has hitherto been continued, to be no longer necessary: but propose that from this time it should gradually be removed; being apprehensive that it might be prejudicial at once wholly to discontinue a plan which has been found so beneficial. At the same time we feel it our duty humbly, but earnestly, to recommend to His Majesty a strict attention to avoid, as much as possible, any hurry, or excess of fatigue, especially during the heat which may be expected for some weeks to come. And we have further to suggest to His Majesty the propriety of removing to the sea side, after the heat of the summer is past, as a measure likely to confirm the reestablishment of his health; the latter part of the summer being the season which has by general experience been found the most beneficial for that purpose.
