by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King Defender of the Faith Do by this Writing in the nature

of a last Will and Testament signed with Our Royal Sign Manual and published by Us in the presence of and attested by the three persons whose names are hereunto subscribed as Witnesses to Our Signing and publishing the same, declare Our Royal Will and Intention as to the Disposition of such part of Our real and personal Estate as is hereinafter mentioned from and after Our Demise to be as follows **As** to our Books which are in the Libraries at Windsor Castle and the Queen's House (they being of the same collection) and which are particularized in an Inventory made of them and kept at the Queen's House We do hereby direct that the same shall be enjoyed by Our dearly beloved Son George Prince of Wales and after his Demise We do direct that the same shall in like manner be enjoyed by the person or persons who shall be entitled to the Crown and We do accordingly give the same to Our said beloved Son George Prince of Wales and such person or persons as aforesaid for the purposes aforesaid **As** to all such Jewels Diamonds or Ornaments of the person as have been worn or used by Our beloved Consort we give and confirm the same as far as We have any power of disposing of the same to Our said beloved Consort for her own use and benefit absolutely **It being** Our Royal Will and Intention that Our dear Royal Consort Charlotte Queen of Great Britain and Ireland in shall from and after Our Demise have during her life the use and enjoyment of the whole of Our property at Richmond and of the House at Kew now inhabited by Us with all the Furniture plate and Books therein together with all the Lands appurtenant thereto And that as soon as after Our Demise as Our new palace at Kew shall be completed that Our Royal Consort shall have the use and enjoyment thereof for and during her natural life And also shall have from and after Our Demise the use and enjoyment for her life, of all such property as is hereinafter devised and bequeathed to her We do therefore hereby give devise and bequeath from and after our Demise unto Our dear Royal Consort the said House and the said Palace at Kew and the Furniture Plate and Books aforesaid together with all and singular the Houses Farms Lands and Hereditaments (whether freehold copyhold or leasehold) now belonging to Us or any person In trust for us situate lying or being either in the Parishes or Manors of Richmond Kew or West Thence or any of them in the County of Surry Save and except as hereinafter mentioned **To hold** unto our Royal Consort from and after Our Demise for and during the term of her natural life **And We do** hereby further give devise and bequeath unto Our Royal Consort from and after Our Demise the Use and enjoyment of the House purchased by us of M^{rs} Gordon situate in Kew (late George Schumersstedts) and of the Furniture therein for and during her natural life And from and after her demise We do hereby further give devise and bequeath the said last mentioned House and Furniture and also the House Garden and Appurtenances thereto belonging which we purchased of M^r. Methold situate at Kew unto Our dear Daughter Princess Mary her Heirs Executors and Administrators in absolutely **And We do** hereby further give devise and bequeath unto Our Royal Consort from and after Our Demise the use and enjoyment of the House in Street Street Windsor purchased of M^r. Henry Proctor with the Furniture therein for and during her natural life And from and after her Demise We do hereby give devise and bequeath the said last mentioned House and Furniture unto Our dear Daughter Princess in Amelia her Heirs Executors and Administrators absolutely **And We do** hereby further give devise and bequeath from and after Our Demise the House and Appurtenances purchased by Us of D^r. Thomas Flberden's Representatives (now called Augusta Lodge) with the Furniture and Books therein and the House adjoining thereto and the House opposite Augusta Lodge unto Our dear Daughter Princess Augusta Sophia her Heirs and Assigns for ever **And We do** hereby further give devise and bequeath from and after Our Demise the several Houses with the Appurtenances purchased by Us of His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester and others at Weymouth with the Furniture and Books therein unto Our dear Daughter Sophia her Executors Administrators and Assigns **And We do** hereby further give devise and bequeath from and after Our Demise unto Our dear Son Ernest Augustus Duke of Cumberland the Dwellinghouse on Kew Green which he inhabits and the Ground occupied by him therewith **To hold** to our said Son his Heirs and Assigns **And** in like manner we do hereby further give devise and bequeath from and after Our Demise the House on Kew Green which Our dear Son Adolphus Frederick Duke of Cambridge inhabits **To hold** to Our said Son his Heirs and Assigns **And We do** hereby under Our Sign Manual attested by Us as aforesaid in the presence of the three persons whose names are hereunto subscribed expressly direct that The Right Honorable James Earl of Cardigan The Right Honorable John Lord Eldon Our Lord High Chancellor and the Right Honorable John Lord Redesdale and all and every other person or persons seized possessed of or entitled to the Premises hereinbefore devised or any of them or any Estate or Interest in them respectively In trust for Us shall stand seized possessed of or entitled of in and to and shall convey surrender assign or assure the same after Our Demise In trust for or to Our said dear Royal Consort and our said before named dear Sons and Daughters respectively for such Estates or Interests as are hereinbefore given devised or bequeathed to them therein respectively and so as that the same may be enjoyed and taken by them respectively from and after Our Demise according to Our Intent and Meaning hereinbefore expressed **And** understanding from Our Royal Consort that it is her intention to make some Disposition of her property in favour of our dear in Daughter Elizabeth We for that reason have not made mention of our said Daughter Elizabeth in this Our Testamentary Paper **And** with respect to such other our personal Estate as We are entitled to dispose of **It is** Our Will and pleasure that the same shall go and be disposed of in such in manner as We shall by any Instrument in writing hereafter direct or appoint **And** we do hereby nominate constitute and appoint The Right in Honorable John Lord Eldon Our Lord High Chancellor and John Lord Redesdale Executors of this Our last Will and Testament hereby revoking all in former Wills by Us at any time heretofore made **Given** and Executed under Our Royal Sign Manual the day of

from and after Our a Demise to be as follows AS to our Books which are in the Libraries at Windsor Castle and the Queens House they being of the same Collection and which are particularized in an Inventory made of them and kept at the Queens House WE DO hereby direct that the same shall be enjoyed by Our dearly beloved Son George Prince of Wales and after his Demise WE DO direct that the same shall in like manner be enjoyed by the person or persons who shall be intitled to the Crown and WE DO accordingly give the same to Our said beloved Son George Prince of Wales and such person or persons as aforesaid for the purposes aforesaid AS to all such Jewels Diamonds or Ornaments of the person as have been worn or used by Our a beloved Consort WE give and confirm the same as far as we have any Power of disposing of the same to our said beloved Consort for her own Use and Benefit absolutely IT being Our Royal Will and Intention that Our dear Royal Consort Charlotte Queen of Great Britain and Ireland shall from and after Our Demise have during her life the use and enjoyment of the whole of Our Property at Richmond and of the a House at New now inhabited by Us with all the Furniture Plate ~~and~~ and Books therein together with all the Lands appurtenant thereto And that as soon after our Demise as Our new palace at New shall be completed that Our Royal Consort shall have the use and enjoyment a thereof for and during her natural life and also shall have from and after Our Demise the Use and Enjoyment for her life of all such Property as is hereinafter devised and bequeathed to her WE DO therefore hereby give devise and bequeath from and after Our Demise unto Our dear Royal Consort the said House and the said Palace at New and the Furniture plate and Books aforesaid together with all and in singular the Houses Farms Lands and Hereditaments (whether Freehold Copyhold or Leasehold) now belonging to Us or any person In trust for Us situate lying or being either in the parishes or Manors of Richmond New or West Threene or any of them in the County of a Surrey (save and except as hereinafter mentioned) TO hold unto Our Royal Consort from and after Our Demise for and during the term of her natural life And we do hereby further give devise and bequeath unto Our Royal Consort from and after Our Demise, the Use and Enjoyment of the House purchased by Us of M^r Gordon situate in New (late George Schenmerstedts) and of the Furniture therein for and during her natural life And from and after her Demise WE DO hereby further give devise and bequeath the said last mentioned House and a Furniture and also the House Garden and Appurtenances thereto belonging which we purchased of M^r Melhold situate at New unto Our dear a Daughter Princess Mary her Heirs Executors and Administrators absolutely AND we do hereby further give devise and bequeath unto Our Royal Consort from and after Our Demise the use and enjoyment of the House in Street Street Windsor purchased of M^r Henry Proctor with the Furniture therein for and during her natural life And from and after her Demise WE DO hereby give devise and bequeath the said last a mentioned House Appurtenances purchased by Us of His Royal a Highness the Duke of Gloucester and others at Wymouth with the Furniture and Books therein unto Our dear Daughter Sophia her a Executors Administrators and Assigns AND we do hereby further give devise and bequeath from and after Our Demise unto Our dear a Son Ernest Augustus Duke of Cumberland the Dwellinghouse on New Green which he inhabits and the personal Estate as we are entitled to dispose of It is our Will and pleasure that the same shall go and be disposed of in such manner as we shall by any Instrument in writing hereafter direct or appoint AND WE DO hereby nominate constitute and appoint The Right Honorable John Lord Eldon Our Lord High Chancellor and John Lord Redesdale Executors of this Our last Will and Testament hereby
