Lieut. Gen. Conway humbly presumes
 to submit to his Majesty's consideration, in absence
 of the Duke of Grafton whether in so critical
 a situation of Affairs as is represented in Sir
 John Goodrich's letter of the 23rd July herewith
 inclos'd, it wou'd not be proper without any loss
 of time (the whole of our interest in Sweden seeming
 to depend on it) to give Sir John Goodrich an
 order to advance a sum of money on this occasion
 as far as Two or Three Thousand pounds at
 least, at his discretion?

If it has his Majesty's approbation & his
 commands are signified, a Messenger shou'd
 be dispatch'd this night to Sir John Goodrich
 to acquaint him therewith.

His Majesty will also see by M^r Sillley's letter

in this Paper that the future conduct of the
Court of Denmark will probably depend
upon the Resolutions of the Swedish Diet.
