Lord Wellesley presents his humble duty to Your Royal Highness, & is much concerned to be obliged to solicit Your Royal Highness' notice to the conduct of M. De Sousa, the Ambassador from Portugal, to whom the letters of M. Narvich from Petersburg, which Your Royal Highness has seen during the last week, were perfectly well known: M. De Sousa however has not attempted to make any intimation of

of the important intelligence contained
in those letters, respecting the affairs of
India, to Lord Wellesley.

Your Royal Highness will not fail
to remark that this omission on the
part of Mr. De Souza is unpardonable,
& leads to very unfavorable conclusions
respecting the disposition of that
Minister.
