Sir
A friend of mine has
been engaged to give a complete life of Lord
Nelson, for which purpose all his Lordship's
papers are put into his possession; among
them is found a plan to prevent or
repell invasion in Lord Nelson's own
hand writing, my friend assures me that it is
of the utmost importance, and will certainly
be adopted when it is known. I wrote to
Lord Murray on it, and offered to confine the
papers to his Lordship if he would be so
good to hand them to the Prince Regent,

his Lordship has answered that the proper
way would be to address you on the
subject, and to propose to wait on
you with it, whenever you should
appoint to receive it. —
