On board the Victory Nov. 23 44

Sir

I have the honor to send you herewith
a letter for Count Mauter, which I beg you will
be pleased to forward to him — I came here
by the express desire of Sir James Saumarez
to concert with him the measures to be taken
about the arms, & send for the support of
Prussia — I very much fear we will be obliged
to send them back, considering the very advan-
ced season, and the uncertainty of the breaking
out of the war — though I have not the least
doubt, but bona parte will attack Prussia
as soon as he thinks her deprived of
Culling Charles Smith Esq

every assistance from England - Sir James has
given the most positive orders, to use the ut-
most endeavours to get these arms loaded,
if asked for in time - and I hope to find things
advanced far enough on my return, to be authorized
to try to get them loaded -
