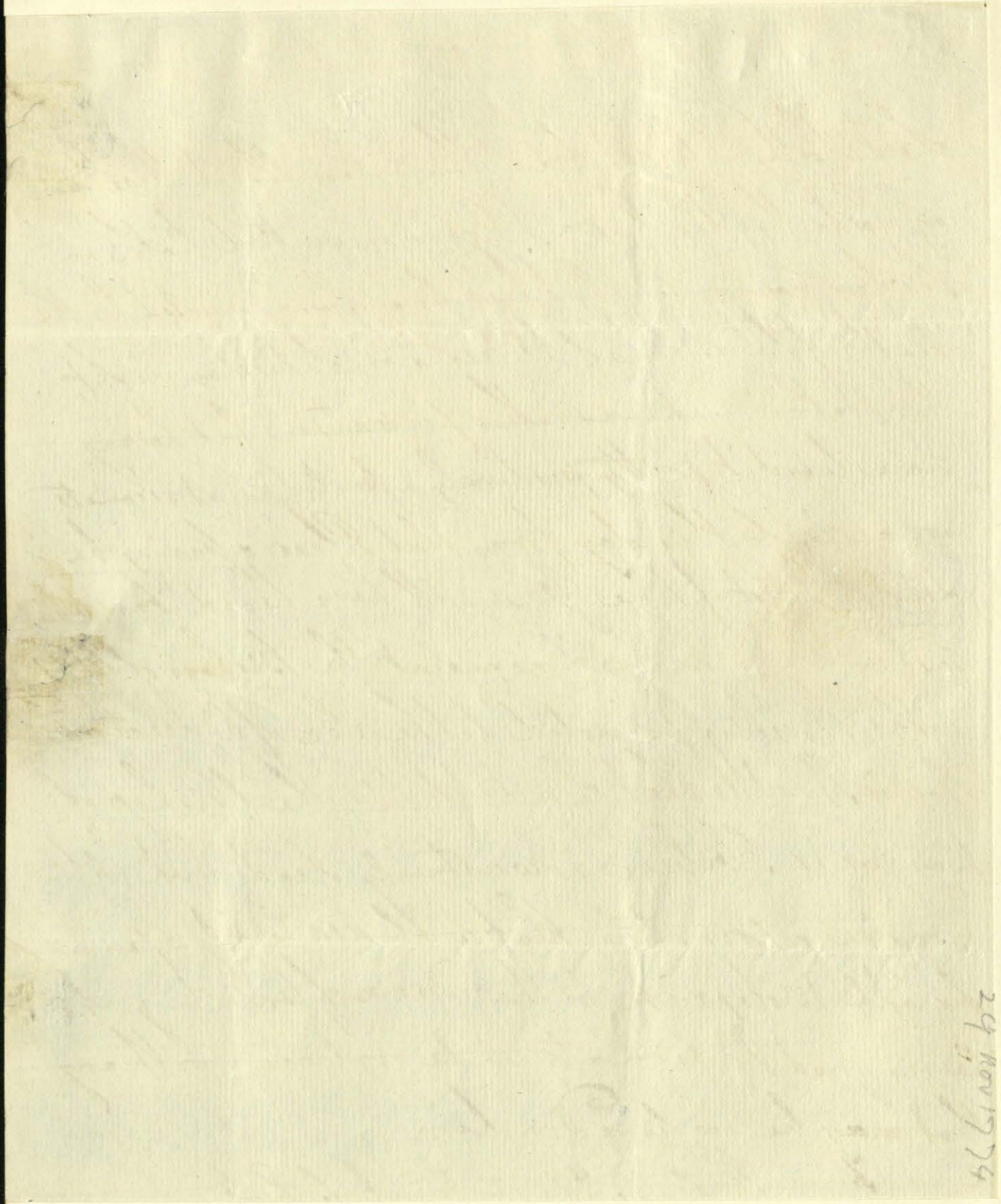

Lord North, I learnt from the Chancellor at the House
of Lords this day, that a Clergyman quitted Bath on
Sunday morning to solicit him for a Living vacated by the
death of the Bishop of Worcester on Saturday night;
his Father think was rather premature but having
since heard it pretty positively asserted that accounts
are arrived this day from that Place assuring he is
dead, I trust if true you will have heard it in which
case I desire you will acquaint the Bishop of ~~Litchfield~~
with his being promoted to the See of Worcester and
Doctor Hard to that of Litchfield; the Bishop of
Bangor is I believe now certainly dead which will
occasion a promotion that will certainly open a
small Bishoprick for the Dean of Canterbury who
having good Performances can be contented with any
that may be conferred on him
