But circumstanced as things are in this Colony, we cannot flatter ourselves of the hower of closing much, the Shirit of Opposition wheel to generally prevails against the Officers of the Customs, and the peculiar Situation we are in by reason of this popular Government must of consequence diminish our power if not totally clestroy it, and terhaps we cannot acquit ourselves to well by any means as by communicating the present state of things here
