Dear Mr. Mahon

I set off for Ireland to-morrow, but before I leave this Country I must request ^{you} to bear in mind, what I lately communicated to you, namely, that it is a great object with me to become one of the Representative Peers of Ireland

I collected from you in our Conversation on this Subject that the Poine Report was favourably disposed towards Lord Sefton & Lord Londonderry but that with the Exception of these two he had no Work in favour of any other Irish Peer I need not repeat to you the Grounds on which I conceive myself intitled to the Countenance of Government I will only mention that I ^{was} the only Irish Peer who supported the Union and has not been honoured with a Seat in the Representative Peerage of Ireland; I have uniformly supported

The Measures of his Majesty's Ministers with respect to
Ireland, I feel strongly attached as well personally as from
Principle to the party of his Royal Highness the Prince
Regent. I am of course very anxious to obtain
the Countenance of his Royal Highness in the pursuit
of his objects & as soon as you may have an opportunity
of leaving his Royal Palace on the Subject I wish
you would have the Goodness to communicate the Same
