My Dear Friend

Your favour of yesterday was delivered to me in Court where I have been engaged laboriously ever since - and in half an hour I am to go into the Crown Court to try Prisoners in assistance of Mr Justice Gase - Your Letter requires in immediate answer and I have not a moment to write.

It was impossible for me not to feel the deepest sense of gratitude for the gracious recollection with which I have been honoured by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent upon the present as

upon many former occasions but if I may be
permitted I would presume to say that at the present
very advanced age of the Parliament I should as it
regards any views or objects of my own very much
prefer not to be returned upon the opportunity which
now offers — at the same time I beg leave to repeat
what I had before occasion to say that if the Service
of His Royal Highness should be considered as in
any manner to render my attendance desirable or if
shall be the pleasure of His Royal Highness to
command it I can have but one duty most
implicitly and gratefully to obey —
