H. Craig, my Cousin-german, on the taking of the Cape of Good Hope.

Meantime, I beg leave to inclose a short biographical memoir of Your, and my much esteemed and lamented friend; which though a simple and unornamented detail, will, I think give You pleasure, and which perhaps You may deem not unworthy of His Royal Highness's Eye.
