My dear General,

I did not return home
till past 6 o'clock, there-
fore the reply to your note
will have been so long delayed.

Colonel M^cNealon's letter
had been no sooner read by
the Secretary to the Meeting
assembled for the purpose of

Ld. Radstock to H. Gen. Turbeville

having it, that I delivered it
over to the Secretary, as a docu-
ment belonging to the Society.

The copy which I retained
of it, I gave this day to the print-
er, that it might be printed
off immediately, in order to be
dispatched to the several Com-
manders in Chief, in conformity
to the Resolutions of yesterday.

I shall with immediacy to the
Printer, desiring him to send

you ¹⁹⁵⁷⁴ a copy of the letter, accord-
ing to your desire.

It was received with accla-
mation by the Committee.
