requesting Your Royal Highness to
signify to him Your Pleasure when
Your Royal Highness should command
the attendance of the House of Commons
with the Address to Your Royal
Highness's gracious Wepages presented
by Lord Castlereagh today.

Mr Ryder has the satisfaction
of respectfully informing Your
Royal Highness that the Address

was carried without a dissentient voice.

Mr Pyder would by leave humbly
to suggest that Thursday would be
in the opinion of Lord Liverpool ~~perhaps~~
the most convenient day for the
view to the progress of the business
to which Your Royal Highness's gracious
Message relates, if Your Royal Highness
should approve of it.

Mr Pyder has understood that
Your Royal Highness had ~~been~~ acquainted
by Lord Chancellor that there would
be no Drawing Room on Thursday.

but he presumes to acquaint Your
Royal Highness that the notification of
its being to be held on Thursday is
repeated in the Gazette tonight, and
ventures to suggest that some means
should be taken to have this charge
in Her Majesty's intention known.

For that purpose Mr Ryder with
the concurrence of the Lord Chamberlain
& Lord Liverpool has directed a Paragraph
to be put into the newspapers tomorrow
morning to state that ~~there will be~~
no Drawing room on Thursday; and
he hopes that this step which the
strictness of the time obliges him to take

without having the honor of a previous
communication with Your Royal Highness
will meet with Your Royal Highness's
approbation.
