Your Royal Highness's servants on that
occasion, that no further attempt at
an Union with Lord Wellerley and
Mr. Gunning could be made at the
present moment by Your Royal
Highness's servants collectively: and
that the loss of strength which must follow
from such an attempt being made in
the only manner, in which, under such
circumstances, it could be proposed,
would in his opinion, counteract and
defeat every beneficial practical object,
