Lord Wellesley has the honor to acquaint  
Your Royal Highness, that he saw Lord  
Grey this afternoon, and communicated  
Your Royal Highness's commands.

Lord Grenville being absent from Town,  
Lord Grey desired to defer his answer  
to Your Royal Highness's orders until  
to morrow. His Lordship however candidly  
stated, that the first impression on his  
own mind was, that the proposal, as made  
by Lord Wellesley, must be declined.  
As Lord Wellesley expects to receive from  
Lords Grey & Grenville a written answer  
tomorrow

to morrow, it appears to him to be unnecessary to intrude upon Your Royal Highness this night; He is however ready to attend Your Royal Highness's orders at a moment's warning; He will not fail to submit the answer from Lords Grey & Grenville, as soon as he shall receive it.
