My Dear Lord

Under the circumstances in which I am now placed I have felt myself called upon to recommend to the Prince Regent the Person who should succeed to the See of Chester as soon as the translation of the present Bishop to Ely has been completed.

You will readily believe that in my present situation at this time it is a most material object to me that this first Bishopric should appear to the World to have been filled up at my recommendation. I have been desirous to make an arrangement, which I think it enables me to promote a Cambridge Professor to the Arch, who enjoys not deservedly a very great portion of public confidence & esteem, might at the same time give me



and the power of doing a very great thing  
act to my own humanity, with which  
I have always kept up more than ordinary  
consideration

I have therefore recommended to the Prince  
that the present Dean of Canterbury should  
succeed to the Bishopric of Exeter and the  
present Dean of Bristol & that the present  
Master of St Paul's College in the University  
of Oxford should be Dean of Canterbury

The Prince has informed me of your  
anxiety for the promotion of your Brother  
to the See or the present occasion  
I trust you will believe how desirous  
I must be on every account to gratify  
your wishes, and I should be most happy  
if you could be induced to accept of  
your Brother the Secretary of the  
with the expectation that he may  
succeed to the See at an early

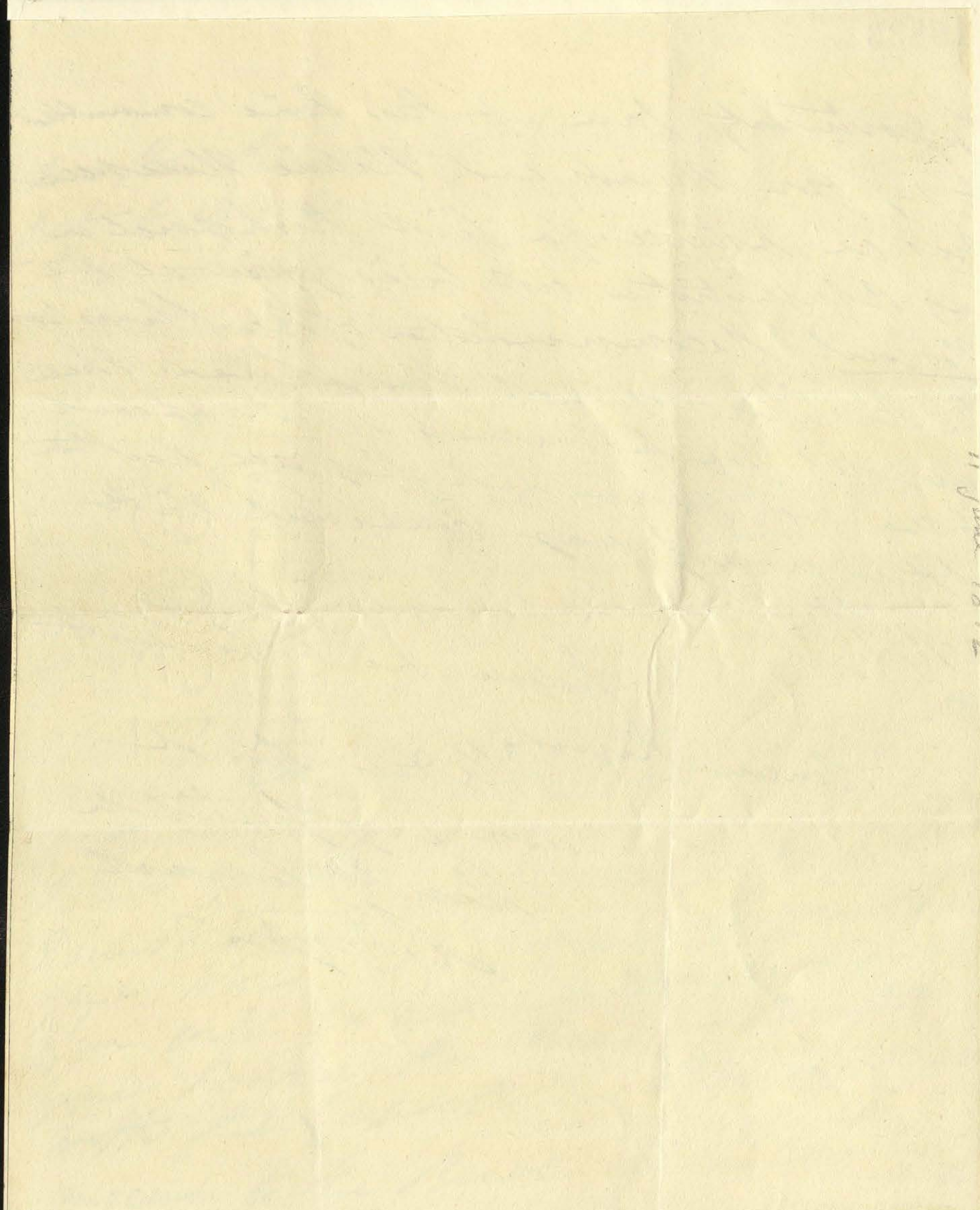
