I have received the envelope
you sent me enclosing Don Francisco
de Mazarredo's Memorial to the Duke
of Sussex, and I have taken the
earliest opportunity of showing it to
Lord Bathurst.

In consequence of some recent
communications from Lord Wellington
respecting the Appropriation of the Clothing,
Arms, & other Supplies granted by this
Country in aid of Spain, it has been
arranged both with His Lordship & with
Sir Henry Wellesley, that no Deliberations
shall be made but with Lord Wellington's
Knowledge & Approbation: as it is considered
that He must be the best Judge where
& how the Supplies can be appropriated.

with the greatest advantage & Effect:—
and also that by leaving to Lord Wellington
the Superintendance of these Supplies & his
acquaintance & Influence with the several
Spanish Commanders & Troops will be extended
so as to be highly beneficial to both Services.

Lord Bathurst therefore proposes
to send this Application in favour of
the Regiment de la Patria to Lord
Wellington, who will undoubtedly feel
every disposition to attend to Don Francisco
de Mezamador's Desire if it is compatible
with the Arrangements which His Lordship
may have already made.
