I beg leave to return  
my grateful acknowledgements

in the Crimea; when I had the Honor  
of being presented to your Royal  
Highness upon receiving my

you were so benevolent as to  
recommend a consideration of these  
circumstances to Lord Castlereagh:  
yet as it was the mark of favor  
from His Majesty; that I considered  
as a reward for my feeble efforts  
in His Majesty's service; preferable

to any pecuniary commutation:  
I should esteem it a more distinguished  
& satisfactory mark of your Royal  
Highness's favor, if I were fortunate  
enough to receive from your hands  
the peerage; an Honor that would  
remind me every day, of the kindness  
& gracious attention, of a Prince  
to one; who's life has been devoted  
to the service of His Sovereign;  
& who's family have suffered  
& bled in the cause of His Country.
