Lord Frankfort's complaint to Col. McMahon as it was his object in the interview he had the honor to have with the Col this Morning to put his situation in as fair a point of view as the time would admit. He mentioned the Duke of Rutland's name but as he thought it does equal credit to his Grace as honor to himself he takes the liberty to enclose his Grace's letter which together with that of the Duke of Rutland shows the favourable ~~disposition~~ disposition entertained of him by Ministers & friends of His Royal Highness. He can also add tho' without immediate authority that the intention of the Duke of Rutland at the Head of the Government of Ireland are such as to warrant Lord F. in saying that what was notice of may please His Royal Highness the Prince Regent to honor him with will prove highly acceptable to his Grace.

It is likewise in his power to state that Mr. Perceval distinctly assured him that altho' He objected

to that part of the Duke of Portland's Eng^t
of the Treasury he allowed it would have been
done had his Grace lived & that he considered
himself bound to perform the Eng^t of his M^{ty}
deceit in some other way which were so
honorably & unequivocally stated in Lord
Townshend's favour
