My Lord -

I herewith have the honor to
acknowledge the receipt of your Lordship's
letter; by which you inform me of my
appointment as an Aide de Camp to
H. R. H. the Prince Regent, for which honor
I am most thankful, as well as for the
gracious manner in which it has been
bestowed upon me. - I therefore cannot
refrain requesting your Lordship to express
these my feelings to H. R. H. the Prince
Regent, adding how sensible I am of H. R.
Highness's kind consideration, in having
taken into consideration upon this occasion
my wishes and interests, as your Lordship
mentions in your letter to have been the
case - since I could have regretted nothing
more than to be by any promotion forced
to leave the situation I hold by the Marquis of Wellington.

The present appointment therefore makes me
the more happy, since at the same time
it does not require this, it attaches me to
the person of H. R. H. for whom I shall
invariably feel the greatest respect gratitude
of attachment - I have the honor to
