The Election yesterday at the India House was
very successfully managed (tho' the exertions of Sir Hugh
Englis & W. R. Moulton & especially the latter) & Lord
Morley appointed Gov^r General, & Comm^r in Chief of
India. The appointments were put separately. On the
first division for Gov^r General there were 17 to 6, & on
the second for Comm^r in Chief 14 to 7, there having been
but 23 Directors Present (Grant not attending) & two
not choosing (from personal motives towards Sir Geo^r
Nugent) to vote on the latter question. The Count did

not

break up till 10 o'clock, & no resolution has taken
 place on the subject of the Court in Chief's salary,
 although much observation attended it. Lord
 Cornwallis from waiting on the Chair, the Board of
 Control &c. I have not been able to see today, but
 I am to be with him early tomorrow in order to prepare
 him on several points which Gordon has instructed
 me to explain to him. Lowton's occupations in
 attending for those two days past on Lord Ellenborough's
 sittings has prevented his pursuing Edwards's
 business in the way I could have wished & expected,
 but I enclose your Royal Highness his Note of
 this evening, by which he promises somewhat for to-
 morrow. I likewise enclose a Note from Lord
 Liverpool of this morning respecting J. R. Esq's going to
