Dear Sir;

As one Gentleman to another, I am ashamed to say, that I have now written to you twice or thrice without the smallest notice on your part. Let me know, my Dear Sir, how to please, or in what I have offended, and two months shall not elapse ^{in vain} after your promise of a satisfactory interview on the subject.

Had I written for the sake of popularity, I need not appeal to your own good sense, that, with the knowledge, powers, and documents, which I possess, I could have much easier produced a Pamphlet of Fifty Times the Public Attention; but I am a child of attachment and affection, and wish to shew my duty and attentions to a Prince whose patriotism and discernment will I hope always be proverbial, and from whom I have been uniformly taught to believe I might, whenever in his most gracious power, expect every gratification of protection and patronage. You perfectly know what I mean; and as many transactions of a delicate nature have passed between us, allow me to hope that I shall hear from you for an interview in the course of a day or two.

The Pamphlet, pardon the presumption, presents a double claim — That from the Prince Regent, and that from his Ministers. His Royal Highness has therefore only to issue or hint his commands or wishes, when there must be an immediate concurrence of sentiment — provided my worthy friend, Colonel M. Callahan, whose partiality I have ~~but~~ constantly experienced, recommends it.
