It must afford you great satisfaction to know that his conduct met universal approbation, and being so immediately under my own eye in several actions with the Enemy, I can answer as to his personal bravery & professional knowledge.

I am sorry to learn that his death suffered from his unremitting attention to his duty (a duty the most irksome & ever experienced) which occasioned ^{the}
