When you have an opportunity I request you  
will <sup>show this or</sup> speak to Col. Mr. Nelson about Capt. Carrol  
of the 9<sup>th</sup> Regt. Infy. A.D.C. he is an officer of long  
standing in the Army and has been on constant  
service, he served the Campaign in Holland  
during the year 1795 (then in the 40<sup>th</sup> Regt.) and was in  
two actions fought there and also with the Army  
under Sir R. Abercromby in the Mediterranean  
during the years 1800 & 1801. - Seven Years in  
India and as Capt. Adj. Genl. to the Troops em-  
ployed at the capture of three Islands and  
Gara, at which latter place 2 Field Officers of  
his Regiment being killed, he as second Captain  
present with the Regiment has been recommen-  
ded by the Commanders in Chief in India for one  
of the vacant Majorities, but which he fears  
without interest at home he will not succeed to  
as there are two Captains senior to him at home  
who certainly have no claim, as they have been above  
6 years at home annulling their claims -
