I have the honor to report through you to His Royal
Highness the Prince Regent that having received a Route for two Squadrons

in consequence that they shall commence their march tomorrow. — Some

Service, will not arrive in time to march with them, but will I hope
be able to join them at Portsmouth; and there will ^{likewise} be a deficiency of
one Subaltern in ^{that of} the first Regiment from the number of Cornets vacant.
