We have had no news from Europe since
the overland account of D. Bellin's
Victory [at Victoria] transmitted
Mr. Linton. No notification or indirect inci-
-dental mention, of the renewal of
the Charter has reached us. We only infer
that it must have taken place: but
do not know, by seeing a transcript for
an English Paper, that there has been

a Brevet we have not been able to get a
gazette to enable us to promulgate
the Pensions. Your brother of course
remains in awkward suspense.
