My dearest Brother

I beg that you will accept of my warmest congratulations on the glorious Victory of Brünne which the Allied Armies have gained over Emperor Napoleon and of which the King has just received the account by a Messenger. The French have lost seventy five pieces of Canon and the Emperor has retreated with the remains of his Army towards Troyes. I do not doubt dear Brother that Lord Cathcart will have given you all the particulars of this wonderful event but I think it a duty to impart what I know on the subject, and to express to you the joy I feel at seeing your enterprises crowned with success, and I have a double cause for

for satisfaction and gratitude to Providence
as my Son the Prince Royal has again
distinguished himself, first by a skirmish
in a wood, and secondly by taking a
difficult post which he attacked at the
head of the Württemberg Troops. The
Emperor of Russia gave him the St
Georges order of the 1st Class on the Field
of Battle. Our Troops have taken seven
pieces of Cannon which I am very proud
of. — I will now my dear Brother
only add the Prince's Compliments and
beg of you to be convinced of the
sincere Affection with which I remain
