Mr. Fagel the Embassador whether you  
<sup>or do not</sup> approve, of the letter I have written  
to Princess Charlotte's Mother and which  
I have sent to him under flying seal  
to be submitted to Your Royal Highness  
and which is or is not to be sent according to  
Your opinion on the subject; for it seemed  
to me <sup>under the existing circumstances</sup> wright to direct this letter to the  
Princess but I would not take this step
