Dispatches have been received
 thro' Paris, from Lord Wm
 Bentinck - They are dated
 from the 24th of March
 & the 27th when he was at
 Leghorn - & the 27th of
 April, on which date he
 writes from Genoa -

The former letters
 state the details of his
 negotiations with Murat,
 respecting the military
 Occupation of Tuscany by
 the British Troops, which
 have been already received
 from Sir R. Walpole, &
 which having been given
 up, Lord Wellesley directed
 his Views towards Genoa -

The principal Inhabitants
 of

offences have requested to
resume their former Govt
& not to be united to
Piedmont - A provisional
Government have met under
the auspices of Lord Wellesley.

Deputations have arrived
from Corsica, requesting
that the Island may be
annexed to the British

from ~~Genoa~~ ~~Cross~~ - Bastia
& Fivizzano had been taken
by the Sardinians. &

Sabot was expected to fall
Lord Wellesley had sent
an Officer with a few
Troops to the island, & if
hostilities ceased in Italy
he proposed to send General
Montreuil there also -

On the alarm being
spread at Milan that

Dupre had still views
 on the sovereignty of Italy,
 an Instruction Book out,
 in which the Minister of
 Finance was consulted: &
 the principal Inhabitants
 had petitioned Lord W^m
 Bentinck to come to their
 assistance, & take measures
 to preserve tranquillity.
 Lord William was about
 to ^{send} Genl. Macfarlane to
 Milan —

The Queen of Austria,
 Sister of Ferdinand VIII.
 has written from Rome
 to Lord William Bentinck
 setting forth the claims
 of Spain in Tuscany & Italy
 as opposed to those of any
 branch of the house of
 Austria — Lord William has

only acknowledged the
letter.

The King of Sardinia having
demanded the execution of
the convention of Paris for the
evacuation of territories not
French. Lord William had
addressed to him a strong
letter, urging his immediate
compliance with the terms
of the same.

Charles IV of Spain has
also applied to Lord William
from Rome, for a conveyance
to Spain.

Lord William had had an
interview with the Pope at
Bologna. His Holiness com-
plained of the treatment he
had received from Murat,
who had not been able to
prevail on him to inaugurate
him as King of Naples, on the
plea

plea, that he could ^{do} no
 act of state, until he
 was in full power &
 dignity at Rome - Nor
 could acknowledge Murat,
 until all the Sovereigns of
 Europe had acknowledged
 him - The Pope has set
 forth his claim for a full
 restitution of all the
 territories belonging to the
 See of Rome -

Lord Castlereagh has
 written to the Chevalier de
 Gopri, inviting in the
 name of the Prince Regent
 the King of Sardinia, to
 return to his Dominions.

He has also sent
 instructions to Major Genl.
 Campbell commanding
 in

in The Ionian Islands, &
the Measures for the
occupation of Corfu, in
the name of the Allies,
as soon as it shall be
evacuated by the French
Troops: for which object
a French Colonel is
dispatched on the same
occasion —

Satisfactory assurances
are given by the French
Government, against the
harboring American
Privateers —
