How cordially will you rejoice at Lord Castlereagh's most admirable Speech! no speech was ever rendered so essential a service to the Prince & the Constitution. His Lordship omitted only one important Circumstance, that of the Prince's <sup>Raising</sup> being united in 1791 with the then Heir apparent of Austria & Prussia in the system wisely adapted by the Emperor Leopold, & now so near its happiest completion.
