In the absence of the Master General of the Ordnance, I have the honor to request that you will obtain the Pleasure of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent for extending to the Royal Regiment of Artillery and Corps of Royal Engineers the benefits of the Warrants, dated the 8th Ultimo, establishing certain rates of Pay to General Officers not being Colonels of Regiments, and increasing the rates of Half Pay to Officers of other Ranks in the Army.

Sir

I have had the honor to lay your Letter of the 30.th Ult. before the Prince Regent and His Royal Highness is pleased to direct that the established Regulation for certain Rates of Pay to General Officers not being Colonels of Regiments, and increasing the Rates of Half pay to Officers of other Ranks in the Army (agreeable to the enclosed printed Order) shall not only be extended to such Officers of the Royal Regiment of Artillery but that they shall be placid on the same footing of Advantage and Allowances as have been ordained for General Officers not being Colonels of Regiments and others in His Majesty's Regiments of Foot Guards.
