Your Royal Highness will see in my report of this date to the Secretary of State the strong grounds we have for hoping that we shall bring affairs here to the conclusion most wished for by Your Royal Highness without a farther effusion of blood; and if

that when I see the care Your Royal Highness  
will again have saved the world.
