of his Note, of 19th of July, to

The Prince Regent, had been transmitted
to you by Command of His Royal Highness;
and that, after your Return to Town,
from which you should be absent for
some Weeks on Account of your Health
you would be ready to enter into Explanations
upon the Subject of it, either with Himself,
or with any other Person, whom he might
think proper to name. — It is
particularly wish'd that you should
say nothing more.
