of Lords

15th March 1816.

That an humble Address be presented to His Royal Highness The Prince Regent to inform His Royal Highness the Thanks of this House for having been pleased, in compliance with their desire, to lay before them the Estimates of Military Expenditure for the ensuing year — That they observe with deep concern that the Military Establishments proposed to be maintained in a state of Peace, so greatly exceed those which at former periods have been thought adequate to the Safety, & consistent with the Constitution of the Country, & that this is proposed at a time when no danger is ever alleged to threaten the Security of His Majesty's Dominions, & no just apprehension can be entertained for the Public Welfare, except from the amount of those Expenditures by which all the Channels of Industry are affected, & from which they can only be relieved

by a speedy & careful Reduction in
every Branch of the Public Expenditure.
That we therefore humbly request His
Royal Highness that He will
graciously be pleased to direct such
Reduction to be made in the Amount
of the Estimates now laid before us,
as may be consistent with the real
Interests of the Country, & conformable
to the ancient & established Principles
of His Government.
