Lord Castlereagh has the honor to submit to your
Royal Highness a Private Letter from Lord Castlereagh
which is copied with his ^{Lordships} Public Dispatch, already
sent before your Royal Highness, and which is the same
that the Austrian Reports from Petersburg, as
transmitted by Lord Stewart were much exaggerated
There is a letter of the 8th of February from the
British Consul at Bucharest, which says that
the alarm on the Turkish Frontier was
subsiding, and that the armies on both sides
were withdrawing, Beringsen having set
off for Petersburg.

The negotiation at Munich your
Royal Highness will perceive was in

proposed assignment to the answer from
Prussia - and as the Emperor does not insist
on the indemnity for Reuternois being in
Italy, nor yet a sovereignty, it is to be hoped,
that this claim, (which is certainly binding
under the Treaty of Fontenoy,) may be
satisfied by a sum of money, which can
be applied in the purchase of lands for
him within the Kingdom of Bavaria
