is indebted for its Reputation and
 glory, and perhaps even for its Existence
 It would be unpardonable however
 to conceal from your Royal Highness
 that the Difficulties we shall have
 to encounter are of the most formidable
 nature, and that unless some
 Change takes place in the Disposition
 and Temper of our Records, it is
 impossible to foresee the Result.

Mr Arbuthnot will have had the
 opportunity of communicating to your
 Royal Highness many particulars,
 and we shall have the Honour
 of seeing your Royal Highness before
 the end of the Week in Town, I
