The King has just received Lord Liverpool's Letter dated Yesterday Sept: 1st & will take the contents of it, into his immediate consideration, as the King does, every statement submitted to Him by Lord Liverpool.

— The King is always disposed & ready to give Lord Liverpool full credit, & to believe, that when Lord Liverpool feels it to be his duty to bring any Subject before the King, & to offer his sentiments upon It, that Lord Liverpool does so, from the best intention, & from the most considerate view Lord Liverpool has been able to take, & to form to himself, of that, which he conceives to be most likely to promote, & to be conducive to the King's Interests; But, in a

matter of such exceeding importance, & big
 with all & every thing that is most near
 even most vital, to the very best interests
 & feelings of the King, both now, & for the
 remainder of his life, the King must
 pause, & take time, calmly & coolly to
 deliberate, & to make up his mind. The
 King must not suffer himself, to be brought
 either hastily or timidly, into any inconsi-
 derate, sudden, or premature, possibly de-
 grading & disgraceful, if ever, not fatal
 compromise & Decision — The King
 will therefore, most certainly think it ne-
 cessary, to require the personal attendance
 of Lord Liverpool, & probably also, of some other
 of His confidential servants, before He King
 either can, or shall declare, his sentiments
