The King has considered, & reconsidered the  
Statements & Representations made by Lord  
Liverpool in his Letter of the 1<sup>st</sup>. of September, as  
well as the conversation held with his confi-  
dential Servants last night; & it is (with  
no common feelings of regret, that the King  
resigns, on this occasion, his own Opinions, to  
Lord Liverpool's discretion. Nevertheless,  
the King can not help confidently relying,  
that Lord Liverpool will guard the King's  
Honour, & not yield it, to political expediency.
