Lord Liverpool has the Honour to inform Your Majesty, that he has laid before Your Majesty's confidential servants, the letter from Your Majesty's servants, which has been graciously pleased to address to him, on the subject of the Reductions in the Establishments of the Counties.

Lord Liverpool can assure Your Majesty, on the Part of all Your confidential servants, that in recommending the Reductions now proposed, they are fully sensible that they have gone to the utmost limit, that could be warranted

by any just attention to the Public Safety or
Interest. That they have been mainly in-
fluenced in being these Measures before your
Wise by the Consideration, that the Adoption
of them would enable them to take up ground
which they could steadily and effectually
defend, and that it was their firm
Determination to make every effort to secure
any further Protection in the Numbers,
or attention in the Character or Description
of the National Debt.
