Sir

I am now recovering from a severe fit of illness, which has confined me nearly three weeks, or I should have paid to you His Royal Highness's amount before. I have now sent it herewith, with the Interest calculated after the simple rate to the 30th instant. And I assure you that the pressing want of cash added to my late severe loss has been the cause of my present illness.

I have put a cross as you requested to denote those Items I would most readily take back - some there are in the account which have been sent to me for re-sale and have been re-sold on account of Mr. Fitzherbert - If you

could befriend me with part of my account
I shall not neglect to praise the obligation
and aid, you will have confer'd and
render'd me - Allow me to ask whether
I should send another copy of the
account to Mr. Grey.

The honor of your Commands there-
-on will oblige me -

I am about to leave this for
Dublin on Tuesday Morning at five
o'clock, and should be very happy to
do anything in my power you may
feel me competent to execute for you
there or at Cork.
