St James's Dock rd 22 Novem^r 1715

Sir,

In or about July 1712, Captain H. Heathcote, then Commanding His Majesty's Ship Scipion, left a Lions' in my Care to be forwarded to His Royal Highness The Prince Regent - which was accordingly done.

While under my charge an Expence was incurred by me in the keep of the Animal of four pounds nineteen Shillings and six pence, and an account of the particulars given a short time after to Sir Tho. Sydenham, which yet remains unsettled.

Knowing this day been desired by Benjamin Tucker Esqre to apply to you for reimbursement of the said Expence, I am to request you will be pleased to order the payment thereof.
