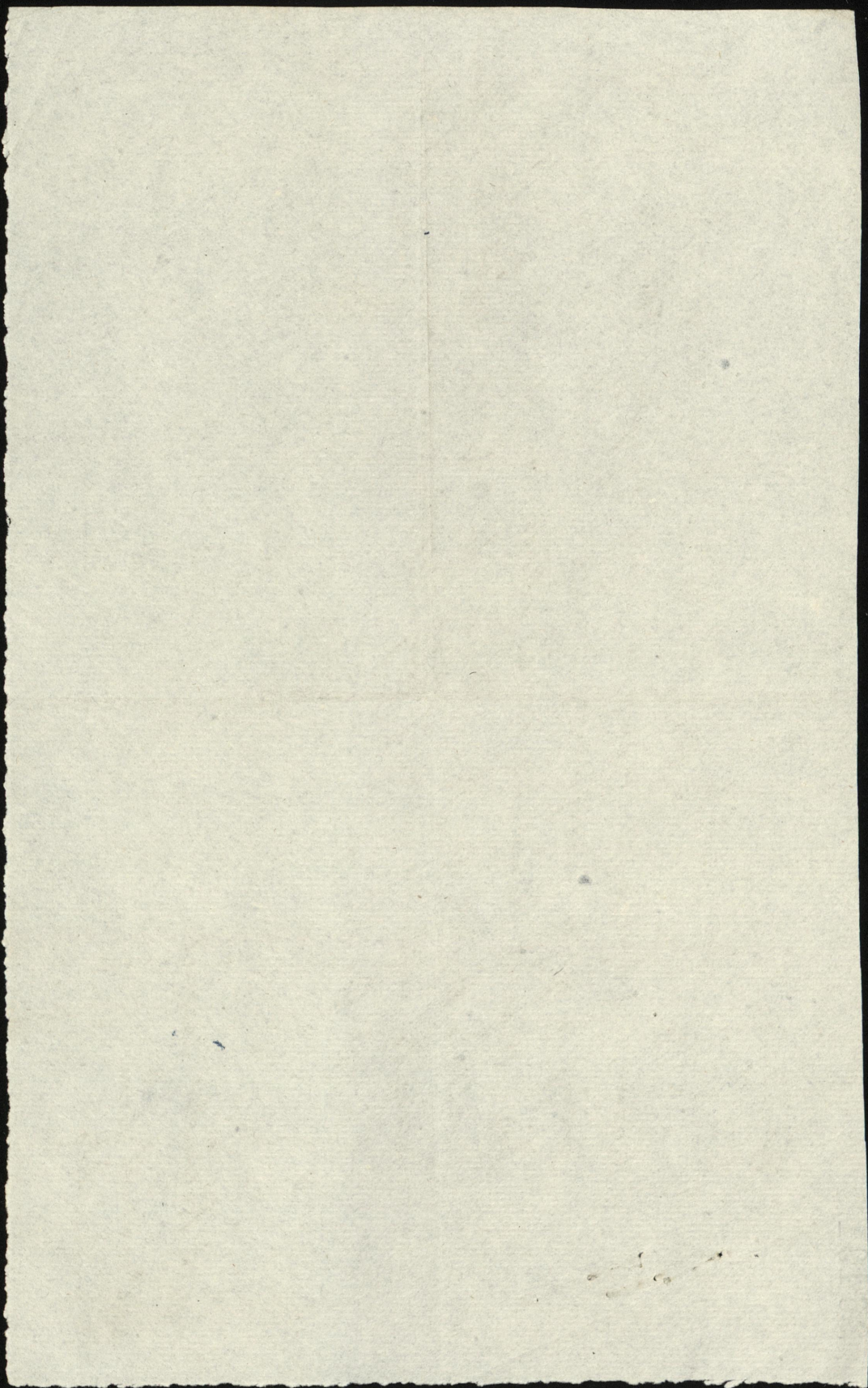

by His late Majesty from the Year 1820, in Arranging prints,  
and illustrating various Books, particular His Majesty's  
Theatrical portraits, with Biographical Sketches, from  
the earliest time to the present day, under the inspection  
of Sir Wilgrove Turner, and after Sir Wilgrove left England  
continued the work untill Carlton House was taken down.  
I delivered my Bill of £20. to Sir Will<sup>m</sup> Stoughton, who sent  
me a Draft for 100 in part, but respecting the Ballance  
of £20 Sir Will<sup>m</sup> has not given me any answer, if there  
is any objection to the Bill, I should be glad to have an  
opportunity to explain. His late Majesty has seen but little  
of the work therefore was a stranger to what I have done.  
I attended Carlton House 7 years. in the Year 1822.
