Your Excellency,

I have already on the 4th of October ¹⁸²⁶ and the 29th of November respectfully and minutely repeated the manner in which a case marked 309 J. H. of J. has been expedited to His Majesty the King, and have sent at the same time to London, to Mr Black Young

- (1st) A copy of the invoice of the delivered books of art.
- (2^d) A receipt of delivery from Captain Hewitt of the Customs, certifying the having deposed the case in the Royal Magazine, London.
- (3^d) A letter and account from G. B. Pie, banker at Hamburg, who for many years has drawn the few payments made through Goldschmidt in London.

In consequence of a letter of Mr Black Young's, of the 2^d of January of this year, I take the liberty of once more sending to Your Excellency the account of the goods sent on the 4th of October 1825, consisting principally of coloured engravings of ^{the value of} 55 and humbly

beg leave to state that thirteen or fourteen years ago
through the recommendation of the late Duke of Brunswick
we have sent to the King himself the historical and
military memoirs of the leaders who died in battle,
as well as a dedicatory copy and a poem, printed
on satin (of which I send a copy) written shortly after
the death of the Duke of Brunswick. The few continuations
have been also sent and as no countermand was received
and the accounts always regularly paid, the last on
the 14th of March 1824 (292 dollars or crowns) (Shake) we have
sent on the 4th of October 1825, the last numbers (which
conclude the whole work) to His Majesty, as well as to the
other crowned heads who have been interested in the un-
dertaking. Without being aware through what person
at Court payment has been effected, I have no doubt
it was by the command of His Majesty, as the bills of
exchange were directed to the King himself, and at all
times were regularly paid (honoured) so that no other
person could have done so.

Therefore we more respectfully request it of Your Excellency
that to avoid further correspondence & expenses (which

already amount to 5^l the 5^l for the last delivery may
 be paid to Mr Black Young, or (though no orders to the
 contrary have been sent) the case No 99 with its contents
 may be sent back to us without delay and free of all
 expense.

With the reputation and full confidence that it is
 not the desire of His Majesty, that we should lose such
 valuable works of art, please the honour to remain with
 great esteem.

originality,

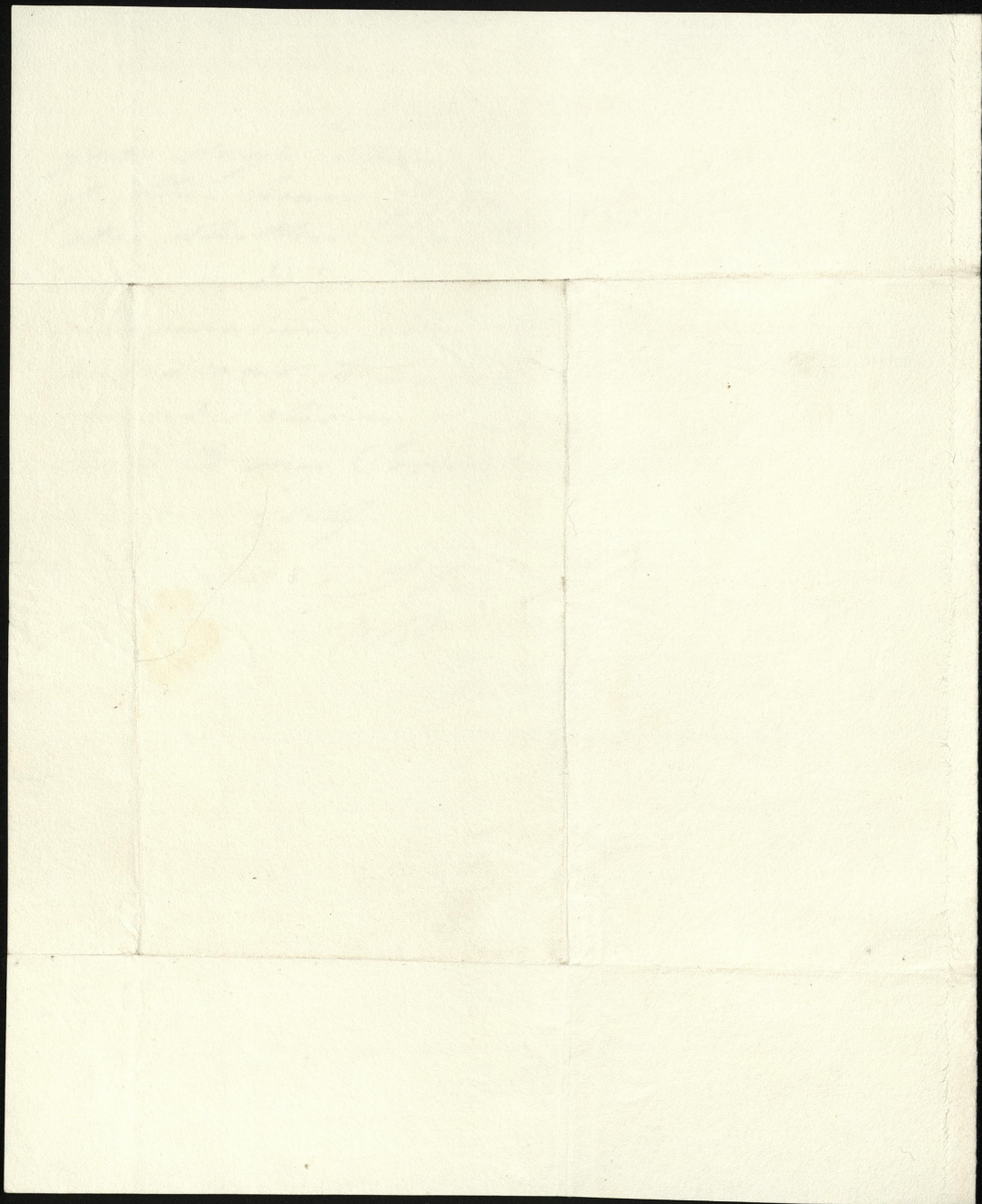
