The remaining Sum of £ 126. for a Bust of the late Duke of Devonshire, delivered in April last, will be payable in some other Channel, and I apprehend it to come under the department of the Lord Chamberlain; but of this you will be better informed by applying to Mr. Satcham at Carlton House.

When I sailed for the Mediterranean
his late Majesty, through Sir And^r Bouverie
commissioned me to procure for him some
ancient Columns, but not to incur a great

I had made arrangements for others, but they
