 the D. of Devonshire have quitted it
 for the Chamberlains Staff & Mr Fox
 to have been Secretary of State but
 this was not brought to maturity;
 Mr Pitt was invited to take the seals
 the D. of Newcastle came into the Treasury
 with Mr Legge; D. Temple being dead
 in stead of D. Gower made. Master of the
