By Mr. Group's report, The Prince Regent was informed of Mr. Dighton's intention to visit the field of Waterloo, but neither directed nor encouraged it, which Mr. Dighton also admits. Mr. Group represents that it is The Prince's pleasure to have all the Drawings by this Artist exhibited to him; & that the price being marked upon each, His Royal Highness has the opportunity of observing the cost of those selected; but I don't learn that the progressive increase of Charge from 10 G.^{ns} to 17 & sometimes 18 G.^{ns} per each Drawing, has been sufficiently pointed out.
